FRNs represent and provide services to all 55 counties in West Virginia, and address a multitude of issues most relevant or pressing to local residents.



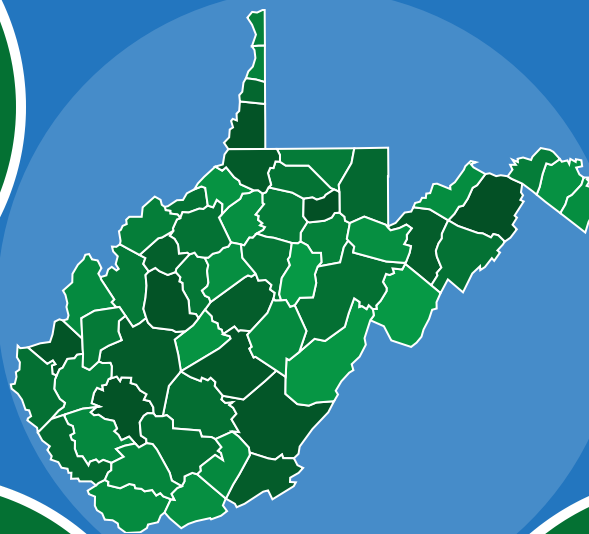
\$12.9 Million in Funding
