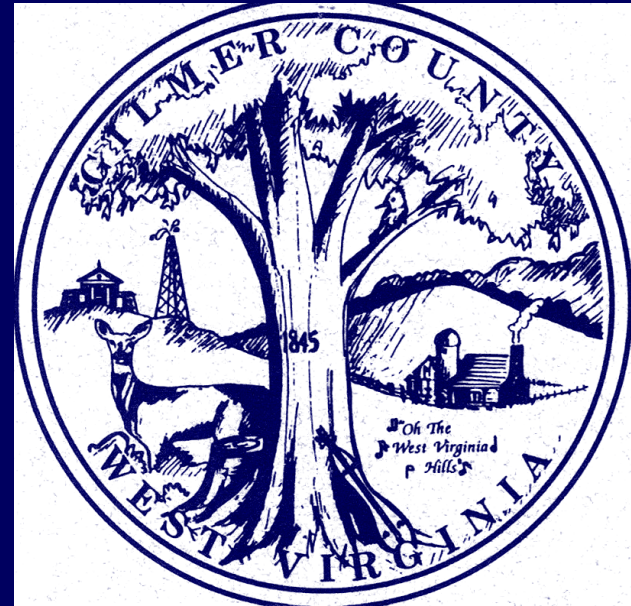

The early intervention services are offered at no cost to families/ no income guidelines and provided in the child's daily natural development (home or community setting). Any child in West Virginia between the ages of birth through 35 months may be eligible if the child is not reaching age-appropriate milestones in one or more areas of development, is at risk for developmental delay, or is diagnosed with a condition that may result in a developmental delay. Anyone (a parent, doctor, caregiver, teacher, or friend) can make a referral by calling 1-304-485-2000. If the child is determined eligible, an individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) is written based on the individual needs of the child and family within 45 days of the referral. (If your child is three years old or older, contact local school districts to see if your child is eligible for the preschool special education program.)
