Clay County Schools also provides the following:

- **Clay County Preschool**
This program is for families with preschool children. The child has to be 4 years of age by August 31 to be eligible. This program provides the child with activities to help them grow mentally, socially, emotionally, and physically. They learn to play with other children, solve problems, and have experience that helps them become self-confident.
- **Adult Basic Education**
Classes for adults who have not had the opportunity to complete their high school education and for those who need to relearn basic skills.
- **Adult Education Classes**
Classes for adults are offered periodically for people wishing to continue their education and or learn new skills.
- **Homebound Teachers**
Homebound teachers are provided for a student who is unable to attend school for two weeks or more due to medical necessity. Call the Board of Education and ask for an application to be completed by parents and physicians.
- **College Classes**
Classes are offered to people wishing to continue their education. These classes are offered throughout the year. Watch the local newspaper to register. Enrollment fees vary.
- **After School Tutoring**
After School tutoring will be offered in each school throughout the county. This program will provide students with tutoring in classes they are having trouble with.

The CAEZ is a private nonprofit corporation, incorporated in 1994. It was created in response to the Empowerment Zone/Enterprise Community program. When the EZ/EC program was announced, representatives from a five county region collaborated on an application. The region serviced by the Zone includes nine census tracts and covers all of Clay County and portions of Braxton, Roane, Nicholas, and Fayette Counties. It covers 800 square miles and contains 29,000 residents. Board of Directors are elected by the residents of the Census Tracts and proportioned according to the poverty levels, with the tracts having the highest rate of poverty having the greatest number of representatives. Each county also has one elected County Commissioner serving on the Board of Directors.

During the planning process, over 100 community meetings were held to discuss issues and priorities for the Zone's strategic plan. All of this information was developed into a strategic plan that focuses on the following: infrastructure, economic development, housing, education, and health/emergency services. The resulting application for EZ/EC designation was successful. The CAEZ is of of 30 rural enterprises communities. The CAEZ was one of the first in the country to sign its Memorandum of Agreement with the Federal Government. They immediately began implementation of their strategic plan, and during the past years, the bulk of what they have accomplished is as follows:

1. Implementation of a building construction trades program to teach construction skills and provide affordable housing for zone residents.
2. Development of a housing rehabilitation program and revolving load fund.

3. Development of a new home construction program to leverage outside funding sources for construction of affordable housing.
4. Completion of a site planning and targeted industries study.
5. Purchased land to develop an industrial site.
6. Creation of a loan fund to provide financing for new and expanding zone businesses.
7. Creation of an entrepreneurial development program.
8. Development of a multi-county economic development effort for marketing.
9. Initiation of preschool programs.
10. Development of an ambulance station to serve an underserved portion of Clay.
11. Funding for Wellness Centers.
12. Creation of an Arts & Crafts cooperative located at a regional factory outlet mall.
13. Funding for fire departments.
14. Funding for Medical Center in Roane County.

CLAY COUNTY OVERVIEW AND GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION

Clay County formed in 1858 from parts of Braxton, Kanawha and Nicholas counties and is named in honor of Henry Clay, a Kentucky statesman. It is located 42 miles northeast of Charleston with a land area of 342 square miles. The earliest settlers arrived around 1830 to the rugged Clay County terrain. According to the 2011 United States Census, it is estimated that the population is 9,357. Clay County was considered part of the Commonwealth of Virginia until West Virginia declared its statehood in 1863. The golden delicious apple originated in Clay County. The county seat is the town of Clay and two-thirds of the county lies at elevations of 1,000 feet or more above sea level.

Town of Clay:

It is the only municipality in Clay County and has a mayor-council form of government: mayor, 5 council members and a recorder.

County:

A three member county commission governs the county. The voters elect commissioners to a six-year term at large. Annually, the members choose one of their members as president. The county commission has the primary budgetary and administrative responsibility for the operation of county government. Working in cooperation with other elected officials, the county commission provides numerous services to citizens. The Clay County courthouse is located in the town of Clay. The local government is a member of the regional intergovernmental council, a four-county planning and development agency.
